Heart of Colorado FiberArts Guild Meeting Minutes April 4, 2014

The meeting was called to order at 10 a.m. by President Nancy McAninch. There were no corrections to last month's minutes.

Announcements:

Nominating Committee: Becky Longberg and Jane Templeton are still seeking volunteers for some positions including the Program Committee. Jane suggested that since the Program Committee is also responsible for refreshments each month, a separate Hospitality Committee be formed to lighten the burdens of each job. Group consensus was in favor. Libby Fay and Marybeth Anderson volunteered to be the Hospitality Committee for next year. The slate for 2014-2015 now stands as:

Scholarship Committee: Robin Ziperman requested clarification as to how much a scholarship should be for and who would we concentrate on as its recipients, Chaffee County high school fiber arts students going on to postsecondary educational facilities or our own members, who may want to attend workshops they may not be able to afford? Suggestions—if we want to support the education of our own members we might follow the Rocky Mountain Weavers' Guild criteria and guidelines; that if a member takes advantage of a Guild scholarship, she does so with the understanding that she will teach a workshop on what she has learned to our membership when she returns; we stay with high school students and make the standard amount \$500; the committee work with county high schools and let the school undertake the recipient selection process; the Scholarship Committee bring a completed proposal to the Guild for approval. Sandee Jaastad moved that a scholarship of \$500 be available to a Chaffee County high school graduating senior this year, Marny seconded the motion, which was unanimously passed. Robin agreed to bring a proposal to the Guild next month. In addition, she will get information from the Boulder group regarding the process of supporting Guild member attendance at workshops.

Fashion Show Committee: Donna Childers reported that only three Guild members have expressed interest in taking Carol Ann Waugh's workshops following the Fashion Show. Arlene Waldorf moved that the Guild commit to the workshops and open attendance to fiber arts enthusiasts outside of the Guild. Robin seconded the motion which was unanimously passed. In order to relieve the Fashion Show chairperson of the responsibility of organizing the workshops, Jane Steiner volunteered to do so.

Miscellaneous: Nancy reminded the group that people need to wear nametags to the meetings and that bringing our own coffee cups saves us using Styrofoam ones. Also, Nancy asked permission of the Guild to donate table favors left over from previous Fashion Shows to the Boys and Girls Club, to be sold as a fundraiser for them at the next Fiber Festival. Kaye Miller moved we do so, Carolee Litvay seconded, the motion was unanimously approved. Officer elections will be held at the May meeting. Next month Challenge pieces are due.

Program: Sandee Jaastad explained how to knit a mosaic stitch, which uses two colors to create a pattern with only one color actually knitted at a time. Guild members followed instructions and found it works!

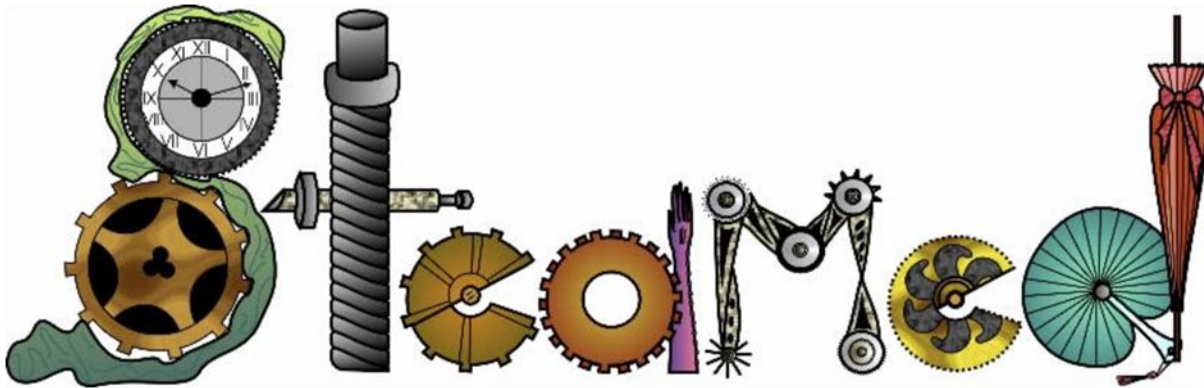
