Pledges include everything from designing sewn and knitted garments, ikat and shibori weaving projects, and making name tags to wear to Guild meetings. Now is the time to show off the results! Members will vote on the project they deem the best response to the challenge and the winner will receive a ticket to the October Fashion Show. We will also have regular show and tell, so let us see what you've been working on outside the challenge.

At the May meeting we will also be voting on officers for the 2015-2016 Guild year. The proposed slate of officers will be announced at the meeting. Nominations from the floor will also be accepted.

JUNE IS STASH SALE TIME:

Saturday, June 6, 2015 is our final get together before the summer hiatus. It will be our Stash Sale, at Nancy McAninch's house (well, her front yard and porch) from 9 am till 12 noon. 

She will be spending several weeks in Africa working as a nurse in rural health clinics there, and teaching local women a special class in “Helping Babies Breathe”. She is raising money to help fund badly needed eye surgeries on the local people, and wants to have at least 40 baby hats (regular and premie size) to give to the new mothers she works with. Get out your knitting needles and your baby stuff patterns, and knit up a hat or two (acrylic yarn, please).

MINUTES OF LAST MONTH'S MEETING:
Heart of Colorado FiberArts Guild Meeting Minutes
April 10, 2015

The meeting was called to order at 10:00 a.m. by President Candace Weiss. Last month's minutes, having been disseminated via newsletter, were approved and placed on file.

Treasurer's Report: Nancy reported the guild's bank balance as of this date is \$2,946.52, which includes prior payment for half of our SteamPlant fee for the Fashion Show in October.

Committee Reports:

Fashion Show/Boutique—Janie Redetzki showed seamstress and knitting centerpiece possibilities for the tables. Because these would have to be made by volunteers with their own materials, she suggested a viewer's choice contest with the winner receiving a gift certificate from Fringe or Serendipity. The guild approved and details will be worked out.

Fiber Festival Booth—will meet to organize today. Diana Smith will be the organizer. Karen Robinson asked for volunteers from the guild to help on Festival committees.

Workshops/Programs—Arlene Waldorf reminded the guild that the challenge is due at the May meeting in BV. Both P.J. Bergin workshops have enough enrollees to be confirmed, each has room for two more people.

Announcements:

Candace announced that Marilyn Bouldin will be going to Ghana in October as part of the Unite for Sight effort to assist people who need eye surgeries. She is trying to raise \$5,000 to provide 100 sight-restoring operations. Candace also offered members the chance to knit baby hats to donate to African newborns.

A nominations committee is needed to create a slate for next year's officers to be presented and voted upon at the May meeting. Marny Danneberg, Nancy McAninch and Connie Bauer volunteered.

The yearly Stash Sale will be held on June 6th (the first Saturday in June) at Nancy McAninch's house from 9 a.m. to noon. Elizabeth volunteered to take charge of the payment table. Individuals with items for sale will bring their own tables and set up prior to 9 a.m. The guild library will also be offered for sale at this time at bargain prices.

Membership dues of \$35 for next year will be accepted beginning at the May meeting.

Janet Yinger discussed elements to consider and ways of organizing a fiber studio and reported on her own project portfolio.
